The Economic and Social Council,

Alarmed by the fact that there is such limited access to education and because of this many families choose only to send boys to school,

Disturbed by the fact that 2.5 billion people worldwide lack access to basic sanitation, *Deeply concerned* that close to 40% of the population of the developing world is living in extreme poverty,

- 1. <u>Endorses</u> open listing of countries that fund groups which pose as a security threat to member states such that:
 - a. This listing would include facts such as:
 - i. Which groups were funded by the nation,
 - ii. How much each group was funded by,
 - b. International companies are banned from,
 - c. Investing in countries which are included on this list endorsed through public relations with international companies which:
 - i. Are currently doing business with countries on this list,
 - ii. Want to continue doing business with countries on this list,
 - iii. Violate the ban on engaging in business with countries on this list;
- 2. <u>Declares accordingly</u> the need for regional intelligence sharing around terrorist groups and cartels such that:
 - a. Nations within the same region have a joint task force that shares information on terrorists and cartels known to work in both areas,
 - b. This information is provided to other nations as soon after being found as possible;
- 3. <u>Recommends</u> a program to be instituted in developing nations with national security threats which allow citizens to give drugs or weapons into custody with no questions asked in return for:
 - a. Available land for farming (maximum of 2 acres) which will be provided such that:
 - i. Available land within nations and the number of weapons and/or drugs given into custody will determine how much land will be given,
 - ii. This land will be taken away if the citizen is found to have drugs and/or weapons,

- iii. The citizen will be arrested if the citizen is found to have used these drugs and/or weapons,
- b. Vocational training such that:
 - i. This training would be provided through working with NGOs such as FINCA, Oikocredit, and Partners In Health (PIH),
 - ii. Training would find a balance between the skills and talents of each individual and skills needed within the nation;
- 4. <u>Requests</u> that a military scholarship program is offered in developing nations with instability surrounding security such that:
 - a. This scholarship program is offered on the basis that this military has adopted a program inclusive of multiple genders and/or ethnicities,
 - b. This program includes providing the best and brightest in the military with vocational training of their choice to help them follow the career path of their choice,
 - c. Citizens who are accepted would be allowed vocational training for as long as they have served in the military,
 - d. Citizens who are accepted would be required to stay in their respective nations and work in these nations for a minimum of five years;
- 5. <u>Decides</u> to remain actively seized in the matter.
